

My basic summary of my anarchist philosophy is that, if an individual is a psychologically independent adult, his behavior should not provably interfere with the freedom of other individuals before it can be banned. If it does interfere, it is a governing force (because it is exercising control over the freedom of others). Only governing need be abolished before a utopia of human liberty can be achieved.

On the way to abolishing governance, there may be required the libertarian innovation of governing only government.

I consider it most effective to introduce society to incrementally more selfless states until there is no longer a need to deter human selfishness, to achieve anarchist utopia. I believe human selfishness can be criminally chaotic without deterrence.

Love, psychological stability, and practicality should (hopefully) suffice to introduce future anarchy.

At the local scale, anarchy is achievable already. Refusing to be governed, and networking with like minded individuals. Experimenting with expertise based work repertoire and democratically selected usage of funds/resources.
